BEAT ON THE STREET

From Neighborhood Watch: Dear neighbors, as you know, we are still striving to participate in the safety of our neighborhood, and part of that responsibility is conveying information to the rest of our community. Oro Valley Police have informed us that OV has had an increase in home invasions. some of them in broad daylight. Please don't leave car or home doors unlocked, even in the daytime, although the perpetrators seem to be targeting homes with absent residents (So don't make it obvious you're not here if you're seasonal). This is why if you see a solicitor or other strange person in the area, please call 911 immediately. The police are there to protect us and have



insisted over and over that they would rather have it be a false alarm than have you endanger yourself by trying to interact with strangers, or even leaving your home to try to take photos of strange vehicles. Recently a truck and motorcycle were parked across from the clubhouse, around midnight, with two persons fleeing on foot. At some point they returned and abandoned the stolen truck nearby, escaping on the motorcycle, fleeing from the police. The police are not yet sure what tie they might have to the Highlands, but the perpetrators, a man and woman were caught and are apparently from the Phoenix area. This summer we had lawn furniture and decor stolen over the summer, cacti stolen from our beautiful landscaping and now this. Police also informed us that a perpetrator was seen looking into windows at night again. They used drones and helicopters but were not able to find them. The police have done middle of the night 'wellness checks' in the past couple of weeks because of suspicious activity in the community. Many of you have reached out to say there

seem to be a lot more 'unknown' persons in the area. Please be aware of your surroundings at all times and call 911 at once if you feel there is something suspicious happening. There has been an increase in volunteer patrol persons seen in our community, and late-night police patrols have been scanning the neighborhood with spotlights recently. We are on a heightened alert to possible crime right now. That said, we could really use some help to increase the members patrolling our neighborhood. Even if you are an early morning walker or casual golf cart rider and are willing to notify the police and Neighborhood Watch of any suspicious persons or activity so we can keep on top of problems here at the Highlands, we could use your participation. Even once a week would lighten the load of others. OV Police have stepped up their patrols, and we would like to help be their eves and ears because we know better than anyone what is normal and suspicious in our community. There's a very interesting segment one of our neighbors posted on research done with rattlesnakes and rattlesnake bites. Posted on May 21, 2024, it starts out:

In a study, scientists used a fake leg to simulate a person stepping on a rattlesnake. Out of 175 snakes that were physically "stepped on" by

the booted foot, only six bit the leg. The rest tried to get away, froze in place, or wriggled in surprise but didn't react aggressively. It's actually really hard to get bitten by a rattlesnake. They just want to be left alone.

Then continues:

Rattlesnakes also don't rattle before striking. A rattle doesn't mean aggression, it's an "*excuse me, I'm down here*." They rattle to tell you, or other large animals, that you are about to step on them, since they blend in very well with their surroundings and they'd rather you didn't smush them accidentally. Strikes are generally noise-free acts of last ditch desperation.

Only about 1% of rattlesnake bites are deadly, and those that are generally happen in situations where medical care was delayed. A quarter of rattlesnake bites don't actually involve any venom at all, they are "dry bites" intended as a warning only. As long as you get to a hospital in a reasonable amount of time, you will probably be fine. This is not a situation where minutes count, just move promptly towards medical care. The deadly bites generally happen in very remote areas, when people are hiking alone, or when drugs and alcohol are involved, since all of these can increase the amount of time it takes someone to get to help or result in poor decision-making.

First aid for a bite? Just get the person to a hospital, promptly, but safely. There is nothing else you need to do, and anything you might think about doing is just wasting time getting the person to a hospital and potentially complicating things by rubbing germs into the wound or further stressing the currently stressed tissue in the area. Don't ice it, tourniquet it, or suck on it, just call 911 or start hiking back to the trailhead.

STORMY WEATHER

What didn't blow down last August in our storm was taken care of this July. On Sunday - the 14th - we had a huge monsoon storm roar through the highlands. This taught us a couple of things.

Water attracts lightening (as does metal - so don't go out playing golf either). And if you don't think lightening strikes around here, my lightening app showed a ground strike that Sunday near Olympus and Rainier Streets.

He also added that they could do it on a Tuesday morning, dovetailing with the coffee hour. That way walk-ups could be accommodated too. There will be a sign up sheet - and time slots to sign up, plus the vaccine(s) you want. The vaccines offered are: flu, covid, pneumonia, tetanus, whooping cough, shingles and RSV.



*Number 1 plastic (water, soda, milk bottles) - All recycling except cardboard needs to be in a bag. This allows us to reduce wear and tear on your roads by only having to go through once to pick up trash and recycle at the same time. By bagging it, it allows us to separate it without it blowing everywhere in your community. TRASH PICKUP:

*We have had some issues with people sharing service, this is NOT ACCEPTABLE. It is stealing and when we find the persons sharing, they will be cut off from our service. So please do not share service; we are a local company just trying to make a living.

CITRUS CARE-FERTILIZATION

Preparation:

- Circle out anywhere from 2-4' from the tree trunk, depending on the maturity of the tree following/tracking root growth.
- Around that diameter dig a ditch approx. 3-6" deep.
- In the ditch, sprinkle 2-3 Tablespoon of fertilizer around the diameter, then ample water. Recommended Feb., May & August, 3X year.
- Additional key step in Oct., water (a bit more than a trickle, N, S, E, W each 30-minute duration. This nourishes over winter months and protects roots from frost.
- Note: The first year of this process may not produce desired results, although consistency each year will vield delectable tasting fruit whether

Suzanne coordinated with DCS placement center coordinator and the afterhours investigative team supervisor to bring over 60+ handmade quilts and pillowcases for the children's center.

TOWN OF ORO VALLEY RENTAL ORDIANCE

On Jan.4, the Oro Valley town council approved an ordinance establishing rules. regulations and licensing requirements for short term and vacation rentals (e.g., Airbnb, Vrbo, etc). Short term or vacation rentals are dwelling units used as a rental term less than 30 days to transient quests. The ordinance went into effect on Feb. 3rd; however, understanding that some individuals may need time to become familiar with the licensing process, Town Council allowed for a 90-day implementation period during which time the ordinance will not be enforced. The deadline to register short term rental properties is May 5th, and enforcement of the ordinance begins May 6th. Town staff will be assisting short term and vacation rental owner as they navigate the licensing system and requirements during the 90day time frame. Registering for short term rental license will be similar to the online

process for applying for a business license. Owner will need to prepare a list of required documents, provide neighbors notification of intent to rent, evidence of insurance, evidence that the property is registered with the Pima County Assessor as a shortterm rental and a form of personal identification to apply. Short term rental license will be \$80 a year- the same as a Town of Oro Valley business license.

ART NEWS

There will be a repeat of the popular Flower Button Class by Sharon Dennis on April 3 at 1 PM in the resource room. The fee is \$5, payable at class. Please sign up in the clubhouse. The Art Committee is celebrating completion of the Highlands community mural after more than a year in the

making. Here is the story from our perspective: During the winter of 2021/2022 the idea of painting a mural on the east side of the block wall facing the mini golf course was born. Ron Weihl, member of HORAC (Highlands Outdoor **Recreational Activities** Committee) approached the Art Committee about their willingness to design and paint such a mural. The committee was enthusiastic about the idea and set about to draw conceptual sketches to submit to HORAC and the Highlands Board of Directors for approval and funds. Members felt the original wall was very long and would be way too much to tackle all at once but thought it would be reasonable to begin in the middle and work in both directions, gradually tapering off, so that the project would look finished even with only a portion of the wall painted. The basic idea was approved, but by that time it was spring, and several members of the Art Committee had left for cooler climates. In the early winter of 2022/2023. the idea was resurrected, and funds were approved. HORAC got the wall patched, washed and



painted with three basic colors representing the sand, the background and the sky. The artists then got to work making the divisions between the three parts more varied and then chalked in some desert plants and animals. Cold wet weather slowed down progress more than had been anticipated. Wind and sun dried out paints quickly, and the rough surface was challenging, as was the frequent squatting and kneeling required to reach low areas, but the artists persisted. After painting from one end of the east wall to the other with many positive comments from appreciative Highland residents, the artists became inspired to continue around to the south wall, which is first seen when people drive into the Highlands. So, the artists rolled up their sleeves again and kept painting more of the same types of desert plants and animals. In mid-March of 2023, the painting work was finally finished, and a good sealer recommended by Tucson muralist Joe Pagac is to be professionally applied by the end of March to protect our efforts from the elements. You are encouraged to come and take a close look at the work and admire the many details. The names of the artists who participated can be found on the leaves of the adave where the two painted walls meet. A Mural Treasure Hunt, a game of discovery at two levels of difficulty, will be available inside the mini golf storage shed.

Thanks to HORAC for their inspiration and support: members of the Art Committee and other volunteers for painting; Steve Horst for his daily encouragement; Jonathan Kosakoff for his suggestions; Mary and Al Rausch, Bill and Louise Bohrer, John Pangburn and Ron Weihl for putting on the base coat; and Ron Weihl for getting the ball rolling, adding extra blocks on top and providing half a golf ball for Kokopelli. The project was a joint effort of many that will enhance our community for years to come. A total of 88 feet of wall reaching almost 6 feet high was painted with a total of 440 volunteer hours. The cost came in at under \$1000. Volunteer mural artists were Sharon Dennis, Patti Triplett, Terry Wojdyla, Kay DeLong, Vonnie Lincoln, Ginny Tanner, Chris Ardingo, Nancy Clark, Marg Rehnberg, and Joyce Emory.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH - report

BEWARE of RATTLESNAKES on the warm roadway - in the evenings. One 'watcher' has seen people walking, talking on their cells, and nearly stepping on snakes - in the low light of evening.

From the website: Rattlesnake HQ

Exercise extreme caution! You don't want to move around too much or you'll risk stepping on it and will most certainly be bitten. Once you have located the snake, either stay still and allow it to move or else start to back away slowly.

SO YES - THE SNAKE CAN STRIKE WITHOUT BEING COILED - IF YOU STEP ON IT, MOST CERTAINLY.

But, any snake will probably strike you if you step on it.

ORGANIC WEED CONTROL

Yes, there is a homemade recipe which combines vinegar, salt and liquid dish soap.

Read more about it at:

https://nativeplantherald.prairienursery. com/2019/01/how-to-make-a-homemade-weedkiller/

The Recipe

Pour 1 gallon of white vinegar into a bucket. 5-percent household white vinegar is fine. It may take two or three days longer to kill the weeds with the lower concentration, but it does work.

Add 1 cup of table salt. Stir the solution with a long-handled spoon until all the salt dissolves completely.

Stir in 1 tablespoon of liquid dish washing soap. The soap helps the vinegar and salt solution coat and adhere to the weeds.

Blend all thoroughly and then funnel the weed killer into a plastic spray bottle.

This site says that household vinegar (which is 4% acetic acid) is sufficient - but takes longer. A resident emailed me that industrial vinegar is 45% concentrated and is ideal.

Correction from May Fling. On the report of using poison in pest control. The first sentence read "Use poison in your pest control." Should have read, "DO NOT use poison in your pest control."


HELP


Hopefully several bids will be presented at the October Board meeting.

WILDFLOWER GUIDELINES (Reprinted

from the August 2023 Fling)

In April of this year [2023] at the Open Board Meeting some guidelines were presented for growing Wildflowers within The Highlands Community. We recognize that many of our residents like flowers and the colors they provide, especially in spring. We offer the following guidelines for 2023/2024: Please keep all wildflowers in groupings or in flowerbeds; raised beds or bordered beds are acceptable. Please keep flowers approximately 18 inches from road pavement or curbing depending upon where you reside. Do not let your flowers spread outside the perimeter of your property unless you have spoken to and have permission from neighbors that may be impacted. Please exercise caution when planting close to your home. In dry hot weather fire hazards are possible. It is also recommended that you remove dried flowers at the end of the season. RECENT ARIZONA SUPREME COURT RULING REGARDING CC&R AMENDMENTS

The following information is about the challenge of amending CC&Rs in Arizona. The Arizona Supreme Court issued an opinion last March that may require consent of 100% of the owners to make any changes "of substance" likely including all of the use restrictions. But at a minimum, the Arizona Supreme Court's opinion cast doubts on the validity of most new amendments, unless they have 100% consent approval of the owners UNLESS the amendments apply only to future buyers. Despite the language CC&Rs about amending the CC&Rs, the Arizona Supreme Court has said that a general amendment provision IS NOT ADEQUATE NOTICE to inform buyers what types of changes by vote of their neighbors.

Things like changing whether pets are allowed or imposing a cap on the number of rental units. A SINGLE OBJECTING OWNER COULD POTENTIALLY UNDO ANY AMENDMENT ON THESE TOPICS.

In the case of capping the number of rentals all we have to do is apply the cap to incoming new owners preventing LLCs from swooping up future homes for the purpose of renting them. Current owners would be grandfathered in.

The pet issue is totally different. If we were restricting

pets it would apply to new owners only if a current owner had a pet. If we are originally restricting pets, we can't all of the sudden allow pets unless we had 100% agreement of all owners.

BATHROOM REMODEL-REED SNELL

The building code requires that if a bathroom has an accessible stall and a shower, the shower must also be accessible. Unfortunately, the drawing shown in the October Fling has been rejected by the Town of Oro Valley after they submitted it to the U.S. Access Board. There is also the issue of having a dressing space available which further complicates the available space for the accessible shower. A copy of this letter has been given to all board members and may be viewed in the office if anyone wishes to understand some of the specifics. After meeting with Dave Willett and having a conversation with Chuck Meyer, the architect selected for this project, the best solution from a cost standpoint would be to eliminate the showers and convert the area into storage space. Trying to keep showers would add tens of thousands of dollars and require essentially gutting the restrooms and starting from

scratch. There is no code requirement to have the showers, nor is it practical to keep them and so the committee recommends the showers be eliminated and converted into storage. An argument was presented that we have a responsibility to provide showers to guests that stay at the RV lot. There are only a couple of spaces available to rent and our agreement only covers a base `fee and power hookup. There is no mention of showers being a part of that agreement. Anyone staying at the lot is a relative or guest of a member here and we feel certain that they could shower at their host's place. We all wish that keeping the showers would be feasible, but the committee doesn't believe it would be cost effective for the little usage they would get. Please let your board member know that you would like to proceed with the remodel despite losing the showers. Delaying this only adds more cost to the project. Thank you everyone for helping to make this a reality!



SYNOPSIS OF GOLDER RANCH SAFETY PRESENTATION

By Elizabeth Hinds Three representatives of Golder Ranch Fire Department's Community Assistance Program came to the Clubhouse and gave a presentation on fire safety. The information is beneficial to all residents.

*All outside electrical should be ground-fault circuit interrupter protected and all electric tools should be stored out of the weather.

*Cooking safety includes staying in the kitchen when the stove is on and keeping anything flammable away from the cooktop. For a small grease fire, turn off the burner and cover the pan with a lid. If fire is in the oven, turn it off and keep the door closed.

*Grilling should be done out from under the eaves and tree branches, and away from patio railings. Never use lighter fluid or other flammable liquids. Check the hoses on your gas grill tank each year prior to use.

*Smoke alarms should be changed every ten years and their batteries should be changed every year. *It was suggested that seasonal residents turn off their power before leaving. Always unplug items after use, including phone chargers, to avoid electrical fires.

*A free fire safety inspection is available from the fire department. You may purchase a resident lockbox so the fire fighters or paramedics can enter your home without breaking down your door during an emergency.

*Wildfire risk management was discussed due to the recent fires in the mountains. Red, yellow and green readiness door hangers were distributed.

*If you were unable to attend, you can pick up a pocket refrigerator magnet to hold your medication list for paramedics to access during a medical emergency.

HOMEOWNER'S INSURANCE INFO

I recently received my annual statement for my homeowners' insurance and realized the total home replacement payout was only \$108,000 and personal property (clothes, furniture, etc.) was \$60,000.

I contacted my insurance company, Oakley Insurance Group on Oracle Road in Tucson, and had them run the numbers on the three Manufactured Home insurance providers they represent for the best price on increasing my homeowner's insurance.

The best coverage they could find was with my current provider, American Summit. I upped my coverage to \$160,000 with an additional \$40,000 for a complete rebuild, and personal property to \$80,000 with a total cost replacement adder (insurance companies discount personal property claims to garage sale prices without this provision).

I also upped my personal liability from \$100,000 to \$300,000. My deductible went from \$500 to \$1,000. All of this was about \$100 extra for the year.



The Oro Valley Police have asked us to share information regarding the recent rise in thefts of catalytic converters. The cost of replacing a catalytic converter will be very expensive, and the thieves can pocket about \$200 per converter.

Here are some steps you can take to help prevent theft of your catalytic converter:

-Park in a garage or well-lit area.

-Add a commercial catalytic theft prevention device.

-Install an under-vehicle alarm system.

-Etch the vehicle VIN number on the converter.

-Report the theft to law enforcement immediately.

Oro Valley Police Department is asking that you watch for anything suspicious, particularly anyone working on the undercarriage of a vehicle. Please call OVPD at (520) 229-4900 and allow them to investigate. Without the public's help, they will have difficulty stopping this crime.

We have a NO PETS POLICY in The Highlands and many of us chose to live here because of that policy. The paperwork you signed regarding "Rules for Reasonable Accommodation of Service or Assistance Animals" clearly states that you are required to carry a trash bag and immediately pick up any waste deposited by your animal (Rule 6). The Fair Housing Act, Section 504, indicates that you must be in control of your animal at all times, which includes cleaning up any waste left by the animal. The Federal Government also gives us the right to require vour animal be removed from the community if you refuse to follow the guidelines. **PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG!**



If gas reaches \$4.00 per gallon, our monthly rate will immediately go up \$1.00 until the gas price goes down.

Doubling up with a neighbor is strictly **PROHIBITED** and if caught will result in \$100 fine; back payments will also be assessed.






IT'S NOT TOO EARLY!

When the COVID-19 Pandemic broke out, closing the pool and clubhouse was considered by the board. After several weeks, COVID-19 began to spread rapidly throughout the country and some states began to put social distancing into required practice. The CDC began to issue protocols to help curb the spread of the virus.

Shortly after that, the governor of Arizona issued a shut down order for all non-essential businesses throughout the State. This included all public and semi-public swimming pools until further notice. CDC guidelines were put into effect and compliance was expected. Gatherings of ten people or more was prohibited and Social Distancing became mandatory.

At that time, the Highlands Board of Directors made the decision to close the pool and clubhouse to follow the Governor's directive and better safeguard the Highlands Community. They were to remain in force until further directives were issued by the Governor, the City of Oro Valley and Pima County.

The pool and clubhouse remained closed until the Governor made the statement pools could be reopened. On May 20th the Governor said, pools could be re-opened However Oro Valley remained closed until June 1st. The Board had an executive meeting on the 22nd of May about re-opening the pool and clubhouse. A committee was formed and met to obtain more information.

Signs, sanitization materials, equipment and cleaning protocols needed according to CDC, City and County recommendations were discussed and acted upon.

Signage was designed and ordered while sanitization dispensers, paper towels spray bottles, etc. were procured and put in place prior to opening the pool and clubhouse. Some items were unavailable due to high demand or had long lead times which resulted in delays in getting the pool and clubhouse ready for opening.

It was a lengthy process getting everything ready for the opening and it was accomplished on June 6th. Contrary to negative rumors being spread about the Highlands community that the Board was ineffective and nonproductive the pool and clubhouse were opened in a safe and timely manner.

The Board has worked tirelessly at making sure the pool and clubhouse were brought up to current expectations of the various governmental institutions and done so with community safety and wellbeing in mind.

In closing, we would like to point out that additional posted rules and regulations along with Social Distancing are required at the pool and clubhouse for the safety of the individual as well as the community. COVID-19 is serious and it will take everyone being cooperative and vigilant to keep us all safe.

In the short time the pool has been opened, we have already had problems with those that refuse to comply. Social Distancing was not followed, more than one person was in the hot tub, and children were swimming in the pool along with their dog. This is unacceptable behavior and it puts us all at risk.

Please be considerate, follow the posted rules, and sanitize after yourself. Thank You.

COMPLIANCE REQUEST


We know this has been a dreadful year for weeds and grass in the Highlands, but we're asking that everyone

ROSIE'S BEST EVER RUM CAKE

or 2 Quarts Rum
 Cup Butter
 Tsp. Sugar
 Large Egg
 Cup Dried Fruit
 Lemon Juice
 Brown Sugar
 Baking Powder

Before you start, sample the rum to check for quality (good isn't it?). Now go ahead. Select a large mixing bowl, measuring cup, etc. Check the rum again, it must be just right. To be sure of the highest quality, pour 1 level cup of rum into a glass and drink it as fast as you can. Repeat.

Beat 1 cup of better in a large fluffy bowl. Add seaspoon of thugar and beat again. Meanwhile, try another cup of rum. Open second quart if necessary. Add 2 large leggs, 2 cups fried druit and beat till high. If druit gets stuck in beaters, pry loose with a drewscriver. Sample rum again checking for tonscisticity.

Sift 3 cups pepper or salt (it doesn't matter which). Sample the rum again. Sift ½ pint of lemon juice. Fold in chipped butter and strained nuts. Add 1 babblespoon of brown thugar (or whatever color you can find). Wix mell. Grease oven and turn cake pan to 350 gredees. Now pour the mess into the coven and ake. Check the rum again and go to bed.

*A new 1000 watt light has been installed in the RV lot. *There is a binder in the office containing Treasurer's Reports and comments. Members may request an opportunity to review it.


*Volunteers from the community will be repairing the cracks in the road. Work will begin soon.




QUILTERS TEA, SOCK HOP AND CELEBRATION OF LIFE FOR JEANNE VISGAR

HOW TO FLY AND LIGHT THE AMERICAN FLAG AT NIGHT

I was asked to include this information in the "Fling" because a resident was out walking at night and noticed that many flags are not properly lit.

This report presents the Flag Code as found in Title 4 of the United States Code and section 36.

The American Flag is to be treated with respect as it is a representative of a living country and understood to be a living entity according to Section 8 of the "Flag Code". The flag should not be shown disrespect, dipped to any person or thing, never carried horizontally, never touch the ground, the floor, water or merchandise and never worn as apparel, bedding or drapery.

Section 6 of the Flag Code specifies appropriate times and occasions for displaying the flag. Traditionally, the flag has been flown only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and stationary flagstaffs. Explicit permission to use an all-weather flag is also stated in that same section. Synthetic fabrics like nylon and polyester are typical; flags made from these materials are commonly seen in rain, snow and other adverse weather that would normally and disrespectfully tatter or stain natural fabric flags.

The Flag Code also discusses the use of the

American Flag at night. "When a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed 24 hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness."

The code does not discuss any official methods for lighting the flag so long as the display of the flag does not violate the "spirit of the Flag Code". The code further explains that "the dignity accorded to the flag is preserved by lighting that prevents its being enveloped in darkness".

The American Legion has developed recommendations on lighting the American Flag at night. They have interpreted proper illumination to mean a light or lighting plan specifically placed to illuminate the flag. Alternatively, the Legion believes that having a light source sufficient to illuminate the flag so it is recognizable as such by the casual observer is also permissible.



DEHYDRATION ALERT!

First, thank you to Lucy Phelan for giving me the opportunity to go to Rocky Point; thank you to my bus mates for paying cash to the Mexican ambulance; thank you Craig and Jamie for accompanying me on the 90 mile drive (one way) to make sure I was safely back in the USA, where I took to a US ambulance to Tucson Medical Center Emergency.

Second and more importantly, I want to remind everyone about different types of dehydration. I have been trained as an EMT and a member of Pima County Search and Rescue, but I WAS STILL FOOLED!

Here is a list of the seven causes:

1. Vomiting

- 2. Diarrhea
- 3. Sweating, Fever
- 4. Certain Medications
- Not drinking enough fluids*
- 6. Caffeine*
- 7. High Altitude

*One cup of a caffeinated beverage requires two cups of water to rehydrate. Many things have hidden caffeine such as tea, chocolate, etc.

There are three stages of dehydration: 1) Mild, 2) Moderate and 3) Severe. Severe can cause confusion, hallucinations and unconsciousness (which I was).

Only water counts to prevent dehydration, not just any liquid. If other liquids contain caffeine or alcohol, you must drink twice the amount of water.

There is a product called ORS (Oral Rehydration Solution) that can help with stages 1 & 2. Ask a pharmacist about ORS.

Remember, summer is upon us increasing the need for fluids that can only be replaced by water.

Again, thank you to the Social Committee for their response. Maybe someday I will get to see Rocky Point. Carol Richards

CHECK OUT THE LIBRARY



PUMPKIN PIE CAKE

- 1-16 oz. can pumpkin (not pie filling)
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- ³/₄ cup butter (melted)
- 1-12 oz. can evaporated milk (not sweetened condensed)
- 1 box yellow cake mix
- 3/4 cup chopped pecans

Beat eggs and milk together, add pumpkin, sugar, salt and cinnamon. Mix well. Pour into a 9" x 13" lightly greased pan. Sprinkle cake mix over top, drizzle with melted butter and sprinkle with pecans. Bake at 350 degrees for 55 to 60 minutes until done. Serve warm or cold with whipped cream.







reviewing our records. *The proposal to raise the title transfer fee from \$100 to \$200 was voted down.

*The proposal to raise maintenance fees \$6 a month was tabled.

*Bernie stated it will cost more than \$40,000 to coat our roads and seal the cracks.

*We will begin updating the Pet Policy in February.

*Bernie motioned that the Board approve \$2900 to purchase gravel for around the clubhouse and easements and \$900 to have the tiles around the pool cleaned.

*The Social Committee will look into purchasing a ping-pong table to replace the damaged one.

FROM THE BOARD

Reminder Regarding Animals

Because this is a "No Pets" community, there are requirements which must be met BEFORE bringing in an animal. The owner must submit documentation from a physician, psychiatrist or social worker stating the type of disability and how the animal will assist in alleviating symptoms. This meets Federal Housing Authority rules by which we are governed. After arriving in the community, you are required to follow the list of rules you received from The Highlands regarding animals. All animals are required to be leashed when not on your

property. They are not allowed to run into the street and greet walkers! You cannot walk to your "friend's" home without your animal on a leash. Animals are not allowed on other residents' property unless invited by the owner. All residents, including renters, are governed by these rules. Visiting animals are not allowed in the community. Our hope is that we can all live in harmony in this community by showing respect for each other.

Regarding Speeders

Speeding continues to be a problem in this community. This is a reminder that the Speed Limit is 15 mph. Residents who observe speeders should report them to the police by way of the Traffic Control Hotline (229-4933) which is listed on the inside cover of The Highlands' Directory. The more calls the police receive from a given area, the more attention they give that area.

INTERNATIONAL LUNCH GROUP



PUMPKIN CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

Although the original version of these cookies calls for all-purpose flour, pumpkin pairs nicely with whole wheat – so why not go for a dessert with whole-grain goodness? Check out the original recipe at www.kingarthurflour.com/recipes.

2 ¼ cups King Arthur White Whole Wheat Flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
½ teaspoon baking soda
½ teaspoon salt
1 ½ teaspoons Vietnamese

Cinnamon

½ teaspoon ground ginger
1 cup unsalted butter, softened
½ cup brown sugar
½ cup granulated sugar
15 ounce can pumpkin
2 large eggs
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
Grated zest of 1 orange, optional
2 cups semisweet choc chips
1 cup chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Lightly grease two baking sheets or line with parchment.

Wisk together flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt and spices. In a separate bowl, beat together butter and sugars. Scrape sides and bottom of bowl, then beat in pumpkin, eggs, vanilla and orange zest. Scrape bowl again, then add the dry ingredients beating until thoroughly combined. Stir in chocolate chips and nuts.

Using a tablespoon cookie scoop, drop the dough onto the prepared baking sheets. Bake on the middle oven rack for 15 to 18 minutes, until the edges are lightly browned. Remove cookies from oven and cool on the pans for five (5) minutes before transferring to racks to cool completely.


